

Sesquicentennial Celebrations

A new maple leaf logo has been designed for Canada's 150th birthday. It is made out of 13 diamond shapes representing all the provinces and territories. A festival about Canada, called SESQUI, will travel across the country. People will be able to go into a set of domes that are like round theaters. Inside, they can watch a movie, participate in activities, and see live performances.

The SESQUI movie called On This Land We Stand features Canada's spectacular landscapes and the works of Canadian artists.

Many communities across the country are making their own special projects to celebrate. One hundred and fifty communities are creating their own mural of painted tiles. All of the murals will be put together into one big mural of Canadian communities. Volunteers in Peterborough, Ontario, will come together to plant 150 pollinator gardens throughout the city. The plants will attract bees and other insects that carry pollen to other plants.

In the capital city of Ottawa, over 700 volunteers are building the world's largest playground in the shape of the map of Canada. The group includes kids from every province and territory in Canada.
