






4 New Books! 10 Titles in Series!

Jazz's Story

Ordinary people can lead remarkable lives. Often, they do so just by being themselves. Everyone has a tale to tell, or a story to share. Some tales are of **heroic** deeds such as saving people in danger. Others stories are of simple acts, such as telling people who you really are. Jazz Jennings was born a boy, but always knew she was really a girl. She just had to let everybody else know of her identity. But that was no small feat.

Defining Herself

Her everyday courage and **conviction** to live life honestly have made her a role model, a rights activist, and a television personality.
